Mission 17.1 Haiti Mission Description

This mission, scheduled for December of 2017, is to accomplish the following work tasks.

1. Secure Equipment Storage

To build 48 feet of **secure shelf storage** in the innermost room of Pastor St. Lucs home on the compound for the safe storage of church musical instruments & sound equipment, donated clothing & shoes, materials for special projects as well as construction & maintenance supplies, tools and equipment. This stuff is hard to get and if we want to keep it we need to secure it. Also build a 6 foot work bench in the same room.

2. Electrical Service Work

Replace the three 12 GA electrical wires between the compounds electrical service panel and the electric meter on the pole with a single piece of 4 GA underground cable. At the time the 12 GA wire was the largest wire size we had on hand when we installed the service. So we paralleled three 12 GA wires to get closer to the current handling ability we needed for the compound.

3. Another Safe Drinking Water Project

This time trench in another 900 foot of water pipe further into the rural, starting where last project left off. This will serve the safe drinking water needs of several dozen more families. Most of the materials for this operation are already in storage at the compound in Haiti.

4. Replace More Old Unsafe Wiring

Finish wiring another house on the compound. Remove the un-insulated electric fencing wire and iron wire wrapped around nails driven into the concrete blocks and replace it with the correct wire and PVC conduit. This drastically improves safety for the children and reduces the amount of energy loss.

5. Make Inside Bathroom Shower Work

Install a blue 50 gallon water barrel up on some type of platform at about 12 feet or so above the ground, to get better water pressure in the bathroom and especially the shower we plumbed in last year.

6. Evaluate School Space In Clinic

Check to see if it is possible to use the clinic waiting room as classroom space for several hours on several days during the week.

These are the projects that we have planned for mission 17.1 to Haiti. As always I am sure more tasks will be added after we get there. Our plan is to buy our airline ticket as soon as there is enough funds available to do so. We hope to be able to complete this mission and be back home before Christmas. I hope you will again be willing to provide your financial support for this new opportunity to be of service. Time is short.
